

COMMISSION'S STATEMENT OF ACCREDITED STATUS

New York Theological Seminary has been accredited by the Commission on Accreditation (COA) of The Association of Theological Schools since 1958. The school's accreditation was last reaffirmed in February 2015, based on an institutional self-study report and an onsite evaluation visit by a committee of peer and public reviewers. The school's next comprehensive evaluation visit will be in fall 2024, followed by a COA review for reaffirmation of accreditation in February 2025. The school's current period of accreditation expires March 31, 2025.

The school's current status of "Accredited on Probation" means the school does not meet one or more standards, specifically dealing with the following issue(s): Resources (Financial). The school must demonstrate within two years of the time probation is imposed (i.e., on July 1, 2021) that it fully meets all standards or the Board will withdraw the school's accreditation.

The school is approved to offer the following degree(s): DMin, MA in Pastoral Care and Counseling, MA in Religious Education, MA in Religious Leadership and Administration, MA in Youth Ministry, Master of Professional Studies, MDiv
